



Guidance for Personal Services (Salons) during Utah's 'Moderate Risk' Phase*

Updated April 30, 2020

Effective May 1, 2020

(including barbers, cosmetologists, body artists, nail technicians, tanning, etc.)

Industry is open under strict hygiene protocols.

- Follow all employer guidelines outlined in General Business Guidelines
- Both service provider and client must wear face coverings
 - Clients may momentarily hold face masks during hair styling/cutting when ear loops may be in the way.
- Employees shall be checked for symptoms daily, at the beginning of each shift, with a log that can be made available for inspection by the health department. Symptomatic employees must be excluded.
- Customers must have their symptoms checked before services are rendered.
- Appointments should be scheduled to allow sufficient time to disinfect all procedure surfaces between services.
- Service provider should maintain a log of appointments with customer contact information to assist with contact tracing efforts.
 - This could be a simple sign-in sheet with names and phone numbers. This is to help health department staff trace potential exposures. This will only be asked for if necessary, and may be discarded after 30 days.
- When services are not being directly provided, 6 feet of physical distance must be maintained. This includes waiting areas and between clients at all times.
- Contactless payment is encouraged; financial equipment must be disinfected after each transaction.
- Remove magazines, books, toys, or similar items from waiting and customer areas.
